#### NPSA Trusted Research – NEW Implementation Scenario Videos

The UK is home to a thriving research and innovation base, which makes us a prime partner for international collaboration. This is an essential component of innovation, but it can also bring risks.

When undertaken safely and securely, with an awareness of the inherent risks (as well as the legal requirements which must be upheld), international collaboration brings endless opportunity. When entered into without consideration for legal and institutional requirements, international partnerships can pose risks to your reputation and your institution's reputation.

As part of the '<u>Trusted Research</u>' Campaign, the **National Protective Security Authority** (**NPSA**), jointly with the **National Cyber Security Centre** (**NCSC**), have recently developed a <u>new range of learning videos for academics</u>, to help raise awareness of research security risks that may arise when working with international partners, and the role you can play in effectively mitigating them.

#### **Office of Trade Sanctions Implementation – New Unit Launched!**

On 10<sup>th</sup> October, the **Office of Trade Sanctions Implementation (OTSI)** was launched as part of the UK Government's commitment to strengthening sanctions implementation and enforcement to maximise the effectiveness of the UK's sanctions regimes.

The new unit, a part of the **Department for Business and Trade**, is set to play a crucial role in helping businesses comply with sanctions with guidance and online tools, while also enhancing the UK's ability to crack down on breaches.

While **HMRC** will remain responsible for enforcement of trade sanctions on goods crossing the UK border, OTSI will lead enforcement for sanctioned services leaving the UK and trade in sanctioned goods and services involving UK businesses or individuals, globally. **OTSI** will also handle licences for certain sanctioned activities, like standalone services (e.g. professional and business services). Sanctions licensing for goods exports and related services remains with the **Export Control Joint Unit (ECJU)**.

## China's New Dual-Use Item Export Control Regulations

New regulations in China have been announced this month and are set to come into effect from 1<sup>st</sup> December, introducing tighter governance over dual-use items.

Key updates include temporary controls (of up to two years) and adjustments to the export control list, emphasised coordination between government bodies, and expanded risk assessment criteria for export restrictions.

There is also a stronger focus on international cooperation, stricter compliance guidelines for exporters, as well as a new ability to prohibit exports to specific countries or regions based on national security assessments – adding further flexibility and enforcement to China's export control framework.

## U.S. BIS Announces New Rules to Modernise Space-Related Export Controls

On 17<sup>th</sup> October, **U.S. Bureau of Industry and Security** announced a series of new rules in a bid to modernise space-related export controls in the U.S.

The series consists of a Final Rule, an Interim Final Rule, and a Proposed Rule, the first of which will look to remove licence requirements for exports of certain items involving remote sensing or space-based logistics, assembly, or servicing spacecraft destined for the UK, Australia and Canada.
